

Seashore Bill Signed by President Ford

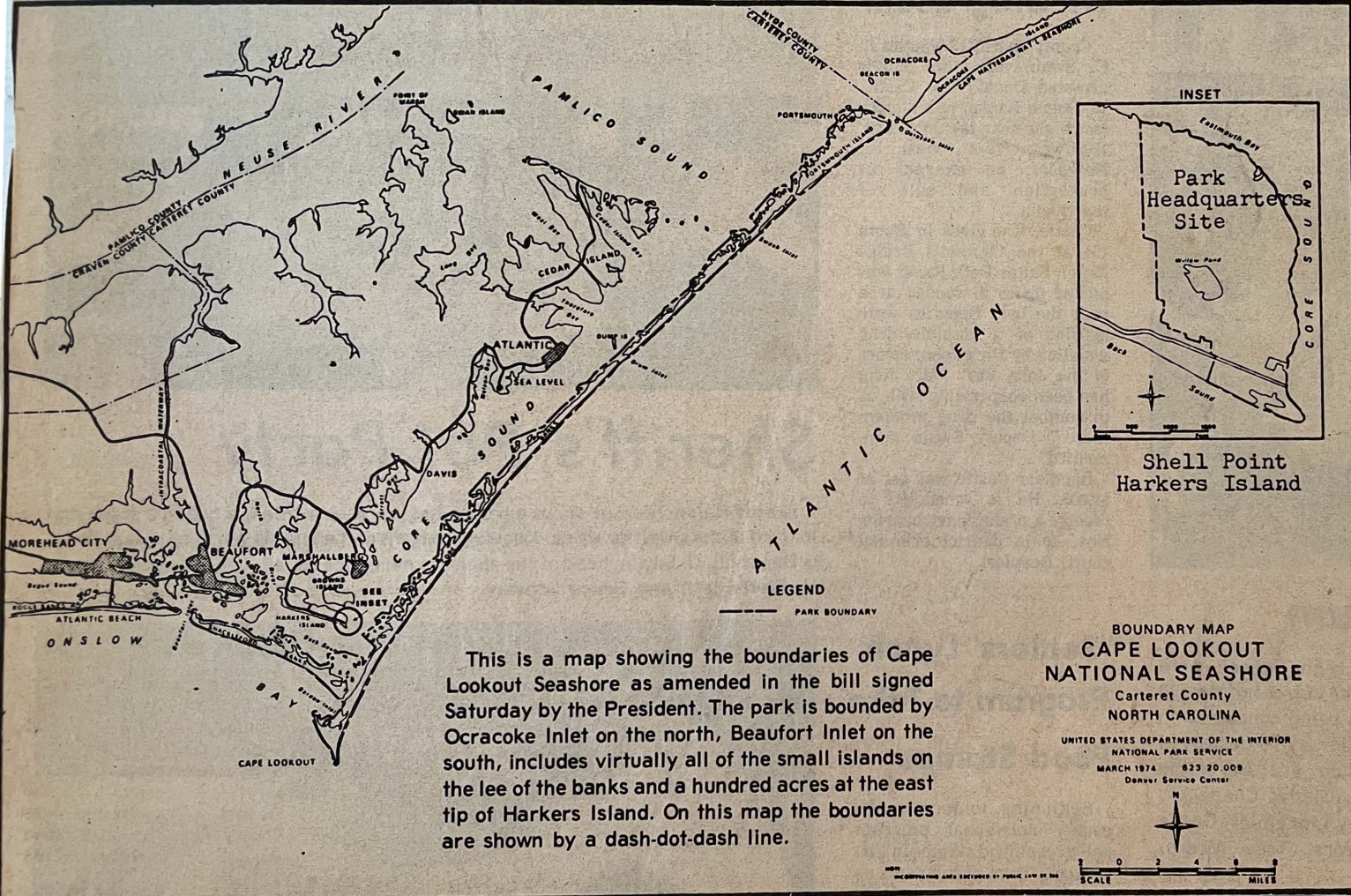

Shackleford, by the government.

THE LANGUAGE of the amendment concerning acquisition of defined park lands follows:

"Lands owned by the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision thereof may be acquired only by donation, but the Secretary, may . . . acquire any other non-Federal lands, marshlands, waters, or interests therein which are located within the boundaries of the seashore by donation, purchase with donated or appropriated funds, or exchange . . ."

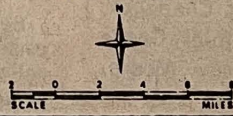
The bill President Ford signed was an omnibus National Park Seashore bill (PL93-477) which provides \$7,635,000 in "new funds." The other money, the difference between that figure and \$7,903,000, was in the 1966 bill. (See Page 9-B this issue for related story.)



This is a map showing the boundaries of Cape Lookout Seashore as amended in the bill signed Saturday by the President. The park is bounded by Ocracoke Inlet on the north, Beaufort Inlet on the south, includes virtually all of the small islands on the lee of the banks and a hundred acres at the east tip of Harkers Island. On this map the boundaries are shown by a dash-dot-dash line.
